## **IBCE Report from DC2017**

Several representatives of the IBCE attended and participated in the activities of the DC2017 meetings, which consisted of the WFC's Biennial Congress, the ACC-RAC annual conference, and ACA's annual NCLC meetings. During the meetings, numerous contacts were made and discussions were held with international chiropractors.

#### Monday, March 13, 2017

Drs. Sal LaRusso, Daniel Côté, Norm Ouzts, and John Hyland attended the opening day of the WFC Assembly of Members and heard updates from chiropractic representatives from around the world. They also had the opportunity to interact with many of these colleagues on a personal level, discussing the IBCE and various countries' professional needs at the WFC's evening reception.

Dr. Hyland met with Dr. Junyong An, president of the Korean Chiropractic Association (KCA), who is interested in having some of his members take IBCE's new KCR exam.

#### Tuesday, March 14, 2017

Drs. Sal LaRusso, Daniel Côté, Ron Tripp, Norm Ouzts, John Hyland, and Peg Seron attended the second day of the WFC Assembly of Members and heard a presentation from two representatives of the World Congress of Chiropractic Students (WCCS) – Danielle Wiesner from CMCC and Charlotte Cailliau from IFEC. One aspect of their discussion included a request for a commitment to fund a \$1,000 annual student scientific award. Drs. Larusso, Côté, and Tripp discussed this and offered to have IBCE fund the WCCS project.

During the morning session, IBCE once again sponsored the WFC's John A. Sweaney Lecture. This year's invited presenter was Dr. Geoff Outerbridge, who discussed his experiences with World Spine Care, the international effort to bring chiropractic care in an integrated setting to people in underserved areas around the globe, beginning in Botswana.

Dr. Sal LaRusso then presented an update of the IBCE to the WFC Assembly. He described the vision and rationale for IBCE's efforts, reported on the ongoing testing in Japan and now Korea (JCR & KCR), and invited contacts from anyone with a possible need for IBCE's expertise.
